Revelation 4:1-11 Study Guide

Read Revelation 4:1-11

1. Have you ever gone through a time in your life when you thought the world was spinning out of control? Have you ever needed the reassurance that, "there is a throne in heaven and someone was [is] seated on it" (4:2)? How can you keep this vision in your mind when you are tempted to believe that your world is running recklessly out of control? What did John see that would have brought him and his audience comfort?

2. For what did the elders and angels worship God for and how often do they do it? How often do you worship God? What keeps you from praising God? How have you or do you take lightly the nature and character of God in your daily life? How might you change that?

3. In heaven the worship of God is the central focus of everyone there. How does worship benefit and strengthen the church? How can you grow in your corporate worship? What should you stop doing in corporate worship that distracts you from your focus on God? What should you start doing to focus your attention on God as your only object of worship?

4. John Calvin (1509-1564) once said: "Creation is the theater of His [God's] glory." What element of creation is most meaningful or profound to you? What one-sentence praise to the Lord can you offer today? Will you discipline yourself to daily express praise to the Lord for His creation and how will you do it?

5. How does the prospect of receiving a crown spur you on in your Christian walk (4:4, 10)? Will you have something to throw at Jesus' feet? Why or why not?
