

#### **Introduction:**

What you believe will determine the way you live your life. Together we will explore the meaning, relevance, and credibility of the Christian faith by unpacking 12 key truths that define the core of Christian belief.

During the course of our training together we will be asking and answering four questions with each of the twelve truths explored. Those questions will include...

- What do we believe?
- Why do we believe it?
- Why does it matter if we believe it?
- How can we live it out?

As you can see, this is designed to be so much more than just another study. This is meant to be spiritual exercise. In other words, you are going to have to do something with this in order for it to be meaningful.

The four questions above create the framework for our time together each time we gather. For example, the first truth we will explore is that God exists. We will answer what we believe in regards to God's existence, why we believe He exists, why it matters if we believe He exists, and how we can visibly live out our belief that He exists.

Here's how all that plays out in regards to our spiritual growth through this study together...

- What Do We Believe? Here is where we will simply bring clarity to what we believe by exploring the key truth and some subpoints surrounding it. We must first be crystal clear in regards to what we believe before we can do anything else.
- **2. Why Do We Believe It?** This is what we would call apologetics. That comes from the Greek word *apologia* and means "to make a case" or "to make a defense". This is where we provide evidence for *why* we believe what we believe.
- **3.** Why Does It Matter If We Believe It? It is in this portion of our time together that we will ask and answer *why* what we believe makes any difference in how one thinks, speaks, and acts.
- 4. How Can We Live It Out? –We will only get out of this study what we put into it. The 12 essential truths we will be studying are just that, ESSENTIAL, so let's put as much effort into living out these essential truths as we do in studying them. Of course, that assumes that you are going to truly study them and then apply them to your daily life.

Along the lines of studying and applying God's Word, and these essential truths, which come from God's Word, please read the following passage...

# What Do We Believe?

In order for us to be perfectly forgiven by an all holy and perfect God a perfect payment must be made to pay for our sins. Since only God is perfect, God must be the One to pay for our sins. Well, the Bible says Jesus came and paid for our sins through His death on the cross. This means that Jesus must be God in order for His death to pay for all of our sins and make us perfect in the eyes of God. But is there any evidence that Jesus is actually God? The authors of The Unshakable Truth really only give us one. Unpack that one evidence from our book (you don't need to list them all, just explain why they are so staggering in a nutshell) as well as using the handout from Pastor Dave to tell why we believe Jesus was God's perfect sacrifice...

While there are overwhelming and abundant evidences for the existence of God, the Bible being the Word of God, that Jesus is God in flesh, that Jesus alone could pay the penalty for our sin on the cross, and that He rose from the dead, how do we provide evidence that He is the one that transforms lives? The answer isn't going to come from a book or scientific equation, it's going to come from the lives of Jesus's followers.

So now we have to begin to ask another question, "If someone were to simply examine my life for evidence of me being a follower of Jesus, is there enough evidence to render me guilty as charged?"

Be careful here, we can have a tendency to say we should always be doing more, or we should always be doing better, and end up living in guilt. Remember, we don't live a life that reflects, honors, and please Jesus SO that He will love us (causal), we live a life that reflects, honors, and pleases Jesus BECAUSE He loves us (resultant).

# TRUTH EIGHT: JESUS'S BODILY RESURRECTION

#### What Do We Believe?

To truly be a Christian, a follower of Jesus, you must have certain fundamental beliefs that have changed you at the core of your being. These are what we would call "essentials", the things that must be believed and embraced if one is to be in heaven with the Lord forever. So, what are those essentials? Let's look at the big 5 that we believe and briefly discuss why each of these are essential to our salvation:

- God exists.
- 2. The Bible is the perfect Word of God that reveals to humanity the nature and character of God.
- 3. Jesus is God who came to earth as a person and was both fully God and fully human.
- 4. It is only by God's grace through Jesus' death on the cross that our sins can be fully paid for.
- 5. Jesus rose bodily from the grave overcoming death and guaranteeing our resurrection from the dead.

While each of those are absolutely "essential" to our salvation, we will be focusing on #5 here. Therefore, in your own words state...



What a blessing to know that our faith is not "blind" but one that welcomes questions and skepticism and then answers all of them. Let's look now at some of the actual evidences for the resurrection of Jesus and discuss how that could and should impact how we think as well as live out our daily lives.

#### Why Do We Believe It?
