## Revelation 7:1-17 Study Guide

- 1. The Lord singles out 144,000 from the Jewish nation and redeems them (7:1-8). What does that say about His ability and determination to keep His promises? Which of God's specific promises have you had difficulty trusting?
- 2. The angels ascribe to God "blessing, glory, wisdom, thanksgiving, honor, power, and might" (7:11; cf. 5:12). While we might have a tendency to just breeze over these attributes pause and unpack what each one means. Which of these is most meaningful to you? Why?
- 3. What does it mean to be "washed in the blood of the Lamb" (7:14)? Do you think most non-Christians understand this phrase? Why can't you just get to heaven by being a good person? What would you say to a co-worker who said, "I have lived a pretty good life; I think God will let me in"?
- 4. Do you worship God like the "great multitude" described in 7:9-17? Why or why not?
- 5. This chapter concludes with ten eternal blessings enjoyed by this great multitude (7:15-17). Which blessing will you appreciate the most? Why?
