- 2. Do you see prayer as a privilege that pleases God (8:3-5)? How effective are your prayers? On a scale of 1 to 10, how would you rate your conviction that God's will is done through your prayers and why do you think this?
- 3. Seeing how easily ruin could come upon the earth, how should you respond to the fact that God has not only preserved but blessed His rebellious world over the centuries (cf. Acts 14:17)?
- 4. How do the descriptions of these judgments affect you (8:7-13)? What effect do you think they should have in your life? How does Psalm 46:2-3 help you grapple with this passage?
- 5. Has God ever used trials, suffering, or disasters to correct your way or lead you into a new path? What happened? What did you learn about God and yourself?
