Read Revelation 16:1-9

1. Based off what you just read and observed, who is the target of the first bowl judgment? Why is this significant? Who is the target of the bowl judgments as a whole? What does this tell you about God's righteousness and justice?

2. Read Revelation 16:5-7 again. This is one of numerous times that worship is mixed with judgment. Why is this the case? How do God's judgments thrust God's people towards worship?

3. Compare the responses of those who receive the mark of the beast (Revelation 16:9, 21) with the responses of Pharaoh in the days of Moses in Exodus 7:13, 22; 8:32; 9:7, 33-35 and 14:5-6. How are the responses given similar to the responses of people today that face different disasters, plagues, and pandemics?

4. What can you do this week to help move an unsaved person one step closer to trusting Jesus so they don't have to face the horrors of the bowl judgments, or worse, the horrors of the lake of fire?
