Sharing the Gospel Clearly and Effectively

1. Where did we come from?

- We were created by God who exists outside of time, space, and matter and has to exist infinitely in order to bring all finite things into existence. (Gen. 1-2; Psalm 19:1)

2. Why are we here?

- We exist to bring glory to the One who made us and to be in relationship with Him. (John 17:3; 1 Corinthians 10:31)

3. What's gone wrong with the world?

- We have sinned against God's plan for us to honor and glorify Him in all things and by so doing have brought disease, decay, and death into creation. (Genesis 3; Romans 3:23; Romans 6:23)

4. How can this world and my life be fixed?

Only Jesus can save you from the effects of your sin and give life to dead things as well as provide the perfect payment for your sin so that you can be declared righteous by God Almighty and allowed in His heaven. (Rom. 10:9-10)
5. Where am I going when this life is over?

- This all depends on what you do with Jesus as God will only allow perfect people in heaven and only Jesus is perfect. The good news is if you trust Jesus as Lord and Savior, He lives inside you and takes away all your sin, so you are seen as perfect in Him. (John 3:16-17; Galatians 2:20)
